UNITY'S MINISTRIES

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES & SUPPORT

Mission: To take care of behind-the-scenes matters, and support the staff and other ministry teams.

CHURCH MICE

Keep offering envelopes and Welcome Pads stocked, as well as pencils sharpened. Neaten sanctuary for church during the week prior to the Sunday service.

CHURCH OFFICE VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers are needed to answer the phone, stuff envelopes, and prepare bulk mailings in support of the church office staff during peak workload times and vacations.

OFFERING COUNTERS

Volunteers are needed to do a control count of the weekly offering on Monday mornings. Sign up for as many or as few weeks as you are available.

BUILDING & GROUNDS MINISTRIES

Mission: To collaborate with church staff in the care of Unity's 6.5 acre campus which encompasses more than 56,000 square feet among our multiple buildings and the Columbarium. Special work teams are organized on a seasonal basis (i.e. spring and fall) as well as periodically to tackle cleaning, painting, handyman type tasks, mulching and other exterior projects. Join us for fellowship and maintaining our campus for members, friends, and visitors.

COLUMBARIUM CARE

Water and care for plants in the columbarium.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION MINISTRIES

CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY TEAM

The Children's Ministry Team works to ensure Unity Presbyterian Church is a nurturing environment where children experience God in all areas of the life of the church. This team plans and coordinates educational programs specifically for children birth through fifth grade and meets every other month.

NURSERY

Careful supervision of our young children is a priority in our nurseries. Although Unity provides a paid nursery worker in each nursery room each Sunday morning, volunteers are also needed during both worship services each Sunday (8:45am and 11:00 am). Volunteers are also occasionally needed during some weekly events and special services. Adults and Middle School/High School Youth are able to serve as volunteers. All volunteers working with children must participate in Safe Place Training and adult volunteers must submit to a background check.

CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

Children in Worship (CIW) is a special worship service for children ages 4 through 1st grade. Volunteers are needed for CIW during both the 8:45 am and 11:00am worship services. Adults and Middle School/High School youth are able to serve as volunteers. All volunteers working with children must participate in Safe Place Training and adult volunteers must submit to a background check.

WORSHIP BAGS

Worship Bags are available in the Narthex for children who plan to stay in the worship service on Sunday mornings. Volunteers are needed to replenish Worship Bags following the 11:00 am service or at any time during the week prior to the following Sunday. This is an excellent family service project.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Sunday school plays an integral part in developing children's knowledge of the Bible and the Triune God. Many adult volunteers are needed each Sunday morning to serve in the children's Sunday school classes (ages 2 years through 5th grade). Volunteer Opportunities include serving as a Teacher, Classroom Assistant, or Substitute. Curriculum and training are provided. All volunteers working with children must participate in Safe Place Training and adult volunteers must submit to a background check.

CHILDREN'S SUNDAY NIGHT LIVE OPPORTUNITIES

Sunday Night Live (SNL) programming is offered for 2nd and 3rd graders for 5 weeks in the fall and 5 weeks in the spring from 5:00-6:00 pm. Volunteer opportunities include serving as a teacher or assistant. Curriculum is provided. Topics covered include Worship Readiness, Sacrament Training, "Learning How to Use My Bible", and prayer practices. All volunteers working with children must participate in Safe Place Training and adult volunteers must submit to a background check.

GROWING CHRISTIANS

Growing Christian's (GC's) is a program of Sunday Night Live (SNL) specifically for 4th and 5th graders. The focus of GC's is to promote Christian fellowship and foster faith building. Volunteer opportunities include serving on the planning team, as an advisor, assistant, or chaperone for occasional off-campus outings. All volunteers working with children must participate in Safe Place Training and adult volunteers must submit to a background check.

NEW BABY WELCOMING TEAM

The New Baby Welcoming Team visits families who have recently had a new baby. Volunteers deliver the Sanctuary rose and a small baby gift, provided by the Nursery Coordinator, to these families.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Vacation Bible School (VBS) is a fun-filled one-week experience for children ages 4 years through completed 5th grade. VBS is held every summer and it includes Bible study, music, games, crafts, and more. Many opportunities to serve are available. Adults and Middle School/High School youth are able to serve as volunteers. VBS includes a Mission Camp for rising 5th and 6th graders. Adult volunteers are needed to accompany small groups of children as they participate in hands-on mission projects in the community. All volunteers working with children must participate in Safe Place Training and adult volunteers must submit to a background check.

PASSPORT CHURCH CAMP

Chaperones are needed to accompany rising 4th - 6th graders to Passport Church Camp, a four day, three night, ecumenical Christian camp experience at Converse College during the summer. All volunteers working with children must participate in Safe Place training and adult volunteers must submit to a background check.

YOUTH MINISTRIES

YOUTH MINISTRY TEAM

The Youth Ministry Team (YMT) oversees the various ministry opportunities for students in grades 6 - 12. YMT has determined the following goals for its programs in the 2017-2018 school year:

1. To create opportunities for youth to develop personal relationships with God by their own initiative.
2. To give service opportunities where students may express the faith they have developed.
3. To encourage intergenerational opportunities that engage in the life of Unity Presbyterian Church.
4. To help establish a spiritual foundation grounded in Scripture.
5. To establish a safe place for welcoming and inclusive fellowship/community to occur.

The Youth Ministry Team is responsible for the overall vision and direction of the programs of Youth Ministry. They meet on a bimonthly basis. Each program of Youth Ministry (i.e. Sunday School, Youth Group, Mission) has its own Planning Team which reports back to the Youth Ministry Team. Adults and youth may volunteer to be on the Youth Ministry Team or any of the Planning Teams described below. All volunteers working with children and youth must submit to a background check and participate in Safe Place Training.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Youth Sunday School Planning Team: The Sunday School Planning Team meets 3 - 4 times per year to select curriculum, help to recruit teachers, and ensure that the Sunday School program is meeting the set goals of the Youth Ministry Team. This opportunity is open to both adults and students in grades 6 - 12.

Middle School Sunday School: Middle School Sunday School encompasses students in grades 6 and 7. Teachers are called upon in a rotating fashion; those interested in teaching would teach every 3 - 4 weeks. Adults may also volunteer as an Assistant Teacher, who would assist teachers in the classroom (gathering materials, engaging students, classroom management) but not have any direct teaching responsibilities.

High School Sunday School: High School Sunday School encompasses students in grades 9 - 12. Teachers are called upon in a rotating fashion; those interested in teaching would teach every 3 - 4 weeks. Adults may also volunteer as an Assistant Teacher, who would assist teachers in the classroom (gathering materials, engaging students, classroom management) but not have any direct teaching responsibilities.

CONFIRMATION

Students in 8th grade embark on a year-long confirmation journey including Sunday School classes, a retreat, regular meetings with a sponsor, and the writing and sharing of their own personal statements of faith. At the end of the Confirmation Journey, students may become full, adult members of the congregation. Although the Confirmation Journey is typically taken on in 8th grade, we do offer a Confirmation class for older students on an as-needed basis.

Confirmation Planning Team: The Confirmation Planning Team meets 3-4 times per year to select the curriculum, develop the guidelines to be used in the Confirmation Journey by teachers and sponsors, aid in recruiting teachers and sponsors, and ensure that the Confirmation Program continues to meet the goals set forth by the Youth Ministry Team. This opportunity is open to both adults and confirmed youth.

Confirmation Teachers: Confirmation Teachers will work as a team to provide consistent leadership and guidance for students in the Confirmation Journey. Confirmation Teachers will cultivate an environment where students ask questions and seek the answers for themselves; they will empower students to take their own initiative in discovering and claiming their own faith. Teachers may choose to teach together or teach on a rotational basis. This opportunity is open to adults only.

Confirmation Sponsors: Sponsors meet with the Confirmation Class in groups of 4-5 as assigned 3-4 times throughout the Confirmation Journey. Confirmation Sponsors will help students to write their own individual statements of faith which will be presented to Session in April. This opportunity is open to adults only.

SUMMER TRIPS

Youth Summer Trip Team: The Summer Trip Team will meet 3-4 times per year, once as a full group in the fall to select trips for the following summer, and as smaller groups throughout the year to focus on individual trip planning. The Summer Trip Team will help recruit adult chaperones, determine transportation options, make reservations, invite students to participate, and ensure that the summer trips are meeting the goals of the Youth Ministry Team. This opportunity is open to both adults and youth in grades 6-12.

Middle School Mission Trip Chaperone: Our Middle School students attend a 5-day Mission Trip with Asheville Youth Mission in June. Chaperones for this trip would help cook and plan meals, help to provide transportation to/from the event, oversee the safety of students on work-sites, teach service knowledge to students, and aid in debrief discussions at the end of the day. This opportunity is open to adults only.

High School Mission Trip Chaperone: Our High School students attend a week-long Mission Trip opportunity in late June. Chaperones for this trip would help cook and plan meals, help to provide transportation to/from the event, oversee the safety of students on worksites, teach service knowledge to students, and aid in debrief discussions at the end of the day. This trip may require that the adult can sleep on an air mattress and stay on his/her feet for multiple hours during the day. This opportunity is open to adults ages 25+ only.

High School Conference Chaperone: Our High School students attend Montreat Youth Conference each year in mid-July. Chaperones for this trip would help to lead and direct discussions, coordinate and organize students in a bustling environment, help with the transportation to/from the event, and provide for fellowship and entertainment opportunities. This opportunity is open to adults ages 25+ only.

MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH GROUP

Middle School Youth Group meets on Sunday evenings from 5:00-6:00 pm for students in grades 6-8. Regular Youth Group includes games, devotions, small groups, and a meal. MSYG meets from September through April almost every Sunday with the exceptions of holidays and special events. A schedule is provided four times per year.

Middle School Youth Group Planning Team: The MSYG Planning Team works to plan out youth group schedules, develop appropriate devotions and lessons for MSYG, recruit volunteers to help implement the plans, and ensure that MSYG is meeting the goals set forth by the YMT. MSYG Planning Team will meet 6-8 times per year to plan for the program throughout the year, evaluate the effectiveness of the current program, and implement changes as needed. This opportunity is open to adults and youth in grades 6-12.

Middle School Youth Advisors: MSYG Advisors help to plan and implement games, activities, devotions and small group discussions centered on the lesson of the day. Advisors are adults who are interested in building strong, committed mentor relationships with our youth. This opportunity is open to adults only.

HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH GROUP

High School Youth Group meets on Sunday evenings from 6:45-8:00 pm for students in grades 9-12. Regular Youth Group includes a meal from 6:00 - 6:45 pm in the Fellowship Hall, games, devotions, worship, and small group discussion. HSYG meets from September through April almost every Sunday with the exceptions of holidays and special events. A schedule is provided four times per year.

High School Youth Group Planning Team: The HSYG Planning Team works to plan out youth group schedules, develop appropriate devotions and lessons for HSYG, recruit volunteers to help implement the plans, and ensure that HSYG is meeting the goals set forth by the YMT. HSYG Planning Team will meet 6-8 times per year. This opportunity is open to adults and confirmed youth.

High School Youth Advisors: HSYG Advisors will help to plan and implement games, activities, devotions, and discussions done at regular HSYG meetings. Advisors are adults who are interested in building committed, strong mentor relationships with our youth. This opportunity is open to adults only.

YOUTH FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Throughout the year, both Middle School and High School students have opportunities for fellowship events. These events function to invite students into the community and fellowship of our group in a non-threatening, non-intimidating way. These opportunities include: snow-tubing, skiing, movie nights, game nights, lock-ins, and caroling.

Youth Fellowship Events Team: The Fellowship Events Team coordinates fellowship events that occur on and off campus for both Middle School and High School students. The team will meet 3-4 times per year to brainstorm events, recruit chaperones and drivers, and ensure that the events meet the goals set forth by the Youth Ministry Team. This opportunity is open to adults and youth.

Youth Fellowship Chaperones: Chaperones for Fellowship Events ensure the safety of students during activities, participate in fellowship events as needed, take pictures during the event, and help with set-up/clean-up of the event. This opportunity is open to adults only.

Youth Transportation Chaperones: Transportation Chaperones are chaperones who additionally provide transportation to/from the event. Those providing transportation must be at least 25 years old and provide a valid drivers' license which will be submitted for a driving check. This opportunity is open to adults age 25+ only.

YOUTH FUNDRAISING

Because the cost of summer trips presents a significant financial burden on many of our families, the youth provide multiple fundraising efforts throughout the school year for both High School and Middle School students. These efforts include Pasta Night, Fort Mill Christmas Parade Coffee Fundraiser, and Pine Straw Sale.

Youth Fundraising Team: The Youth Fundraising Team brainstorms, plans, and coordinates the various fundraising efforts throughout the school year. The team will meet 3-4 times per year to map out opportunities and ensure that they meet the goals set forth by the Youth Ministry Team. This opportunity is open to adults and youth.

Youth Fundraising Volunteers: Fundraising Volunteers are present at various fundraising events and help to efficiently run an event, empower students, and collect money for the youth. This opportunity is open to adults only.

YOUTH MISSION

Middle and High School students have the opportunity to express their faith through mission opportunities within our local and global community. Mission opportunities sometimes coordinate with opportunities put forth by the Outreach Team and sometimes are unique to the Youth. Mission opportunities are sometimes inclusive of both Middle and High School Youth and sometimes unique to each group.

Youth Mission Team: The Youth Mission Team brainstorms, plans, and coordinates missional events on a regular basis throughout the year. The team will meet 3-4 times per year. This opportunity is open to both adults and youth in grades 6-12.

Youth Mission Volunteers: Mission Volunteers help on the day of a mission event to coordinate students, help them to understand the impact they are making, help to provide spiritual framework for the missional event, and help to provide transportation to/from the event if needed. This opportunity is open to adults only.

YOUTH MEALS

Each week, the youth enjoy a supper as a part of their regular youth group from 6:00 - 6:45 pm in the Fellowship Hall. During SNL, youth participate in the meal with the larger congregation.

Youth Meal Coordinators: The Youth Meal Coordinators help to organize the meal providers on any given week. They provide the meal providers with the information needed, collect receipts for reimbursement, collect money from students, and ensure that there will be enough food for all students attending. This opportunity is open to adults only.

Youth Meal Providers: The Youth Meal Providers provide a meal, in part or in whole, for students attending regular youth group. Providers can be either parents or non-parents who are a part of the congregation. Providers can be reimbursed in part or in whole or may choose to provide the meal as a donation. This opportunity is open to adults and youth in grades 6-12.

ADULT MINISTRIES

ADULT DISCIPLESHIP MINISTRY TEAM

The Adult Discipleship Ministry Team seeks to invite and inspire all people to explore their faith and find their connection to God, in order to transform their lives through the Living Word. This team plans and coordinates the Christian education programs for adults, including Sunday school, Sunday Night Live opportunities, weekday Bible studies, and other short-term study opportunities. The team meets every other month.

ADULT MINISTRIES EVENT PLANNING TEAM

Volunteers are needed to serve on short-term teams to plan and execute Adult Christian Education Ministries events such as Kick-Off Sunday, a summer adult study series, or hosting a special speaker.

ADULT WEEKDAY STUDIES

A variety of Bible studies and short-term book studies are offered during the week at Unity. If you are interested in starting or leading a Bible study or book study, or for information regarding existing Bible studies, please contact the Director of Christian Education or a member of the Adult Discipleship Ministry Team. Volunteer opportunities include teaching or assisting in weekday classes.

SUNDAY NIGHT LIVE ADULT PROGRAMMING

Sunday Night Live (SNL) offers Adult programming from 5:00-6:00 pm for five consecutive weeks in the fall and five consecutive weeks in the spring. Volunteer opportunities include serving as a teacher or assistant for a variety of adult study and creative learning options.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Sunday school plays an integral part in encouraging adults to be lifelong learners and to develop an even deeper spiritual life. Each adult Sunday school class has a teaching team that works with the Director of Christian Education to choose curriculum, plan the schedule for the year, and lead lessons. Volunteer opportunities include serving as a teacher on a teaching team or serving as a substitute when needed.

LIBRARY COORDINATING TEAM

This group of volunteers maintains, organizes, and updates materials in the church library. We hope to move the church library to a more prominent room on the ministries hall during 2017 and will need help moving and setting up the new library.

COMMUNICATIONS MINISTRIES

Mission: To collaborate with church staff to enhance communications within the congregation as well as expand community awareness of Unity's mission. The staff and Communications Ministry Team brainstorm, develop, and implement efforts involving the church website, broadcasting online, social media, audio and video, internal publications, bulletin boards, advertising, and other tools of communications. If you enjoy being a part of telling Unity's story, join us.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE MINISTRIES

Mission: To coordinate pastoral care within the church.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE MINISTRIES TEAM

The members of this team are committed to providing love, care, and support to each member of the Unity family. From preparing meals to homebound visitation, the Congregational Care Team strives to continue high quality levels of caring within the church. This team also provides fellowship opportunities. The following sub-teams offer many opportunities for service.

Meetings: Quarterly

BEREAVEMENT GUILD

The guild provides compassionate hospitality to families who have experienced a death. This group assists with set up, serving, and cleanup of either the receiving of friends or a family meal due to the death of a church family member.

STEPHEN MINISTRY

Stephen Ministry is a one-on-one lay caring ministry where congregations equip and empower lay caregivers - called Stephen Ministers - to provide high-quality, confidential, Christ centered care to people who are hurting. Unity is initiating this ministry in 2017, and Stephen Leaders and Stephen Ministers are needed.

STEPHEN LEADERS

Stephen Leaders are a team of 3 to 5 individuals who attend a one-time, week-long training seminar which equips them to establish and direct the Stephen Series within our congregation. They work as a team to provide 50 hours of training to individuals who will become Stephen ministers. Stephen leaders also plan, teach, supervise and match Stephen Ministers to hurting people and meet twice a month with Stephen Ministers to provide on-going training and support. A minimum two year commitment is required.

STEPHEN MINISTERS

Stephen Ministers are lay individuals from the congregation who receive 50 hours of training before providing one-on-one, Christ centered, pastoral care to hurting individuals. Stephen Ministers meet weekly with their Care Receivers (individuals going through situations such as loss of a job, divorce, bereavement, hospitalization, spiritual crisis, etc.) for an hour in a strictly confidential manner. They also meet twice monthly for on-going training and support of one another.

CARD MINISTRY

This group writes notes to church members who are ill, bereaved or have other concerns, to let them know that their church family is thinking of them. Birthday cards are sent to members who are celebrating their 80th (or over) birthday. The notes and cards are in the church office for your use in this ministry. You will receive a letter of instruction, and will be given a schedule for writing notes or cards.

COOKIE BAKERS

This team provides home-baked cookies for the receiving of friends before or after a funeral at Unity, or whenever cookies are needed.

FOOD TEAM

This is a 5 or 6 person team that provides a meal when there is a need within our church family, usually due to a death or illness in the family. Meals are also provided for families of newborns.

CARING FRIENDS GRIEF TEAM

This group offers condolences and support for Unity members after the death of a family member. We send sympathy cards, a follow-up card on the year anniversary and holiday cards. We work in teams to support Unity members who have lost loved ones.

NURSING HOME/HOMEBOUND VISITATION

This group calls or visits those confined to home or in an extended care facility. Volunteers visit quarterly.

PRAYER CHAIN

As a member of this team, you will be asked to pray for others as needs arise.

TRANSPORTATION

This team provides a ride to appointments, errands and Sunday services as needed.

CONGREGATIONAL DINNERS - A SUNDAY NIGHT LIVE PROGRAM

This team coordinates the evening meals for the SNL Program. Volunteers are needed to help set up/clean up, work the cashier table, and serve dinner.

CONGREGATIONAL BREAKFAST

This team coordinates the 5 or 6 congregational breakfasts during the Sunday School hour. Volunteers are needed to set up/clean up, prepare and serve breakfast.

ICE CREAM SOCIAL

This team organizes and prepares homemade ice cream, other frozen dessert, or cookies for this yearly church-wide gathering, which occurs in August.

LUNCH BUNCH

Lunch Bunch is a fellowship group for adults who are free at midday. This group usually meets on the 4th Monday of each month for lunch, fellowship, interesting programs and an occasional trip or tour away from the church. Join this group to work with others to provide meaningful ministries and activities for adults in our congregation.

PRAYER SHAWL TEAM

With prayers of love, care and concern, this group provides knitted or crocheted lap robes and/or shawls for comfort when a Unity family has a need.

ENDOWMENT BOARD

The Endowment Board manages the Unity Endowment Program by making investment and fund distribution decisions in accordance with the program guidelines. They also promote legacy gifts within the congregation. Board members serve three years terms.

HEALTH MINISTRIES

Mission: To provide support and encouragement for the health, well-being, and wholeness of our congregation. This group recognizes the integral relationship between body, mind and spirit, as we strive to be the persons God calls us to be.

HEALTH MINISTRIES TEAM

Meet to plan activities and information-sharing opportunities.

Meetings: quarterly.

CARE TEAMS

Be part of a team that ministers to the needs of a specific church member who may be elderly, ill, home-bound, or in need of practical assistance.

HOSPITAL VISITATION TEAM

Share in the visitation of church members that are hospitalized. Visits may be made alone or with another person.

BLOOD PRESSURE CHECKS

Periodically assist with blood pressure checks.

CPR CLASS

Teach and/or assist in planning annual CPR classes.

EQUIPMENT CLOSET

This team works to increase awareness of durable medical equipment closet to congregation. Team also manages and maintains inventory.

MAINTAIN AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR — AED

Maintain the church's three AED's by checking batteries and defibrillator pads.

FIRST AID KITS

Re-supply Unity's first aid kits, located in various places throughout the church and Ministries Building.

FITNESS ACTIVITIES

Sponsor classes and events to encourage active, healthy lifestyles. Please contact us if you can lead a class.

GRIEF AND LOSS SUPPORT GROUP

Grief and Loss Support Group meets every two weeks on Friday from 10:00 AM - 11:30 AM. Participants discuss the grief process and share experiences that can help comfort and reassure each other that they are not alone. People experiencing any form or phase of grief are welcome.

INFERTILITY & LOSS SUPPORT NETWORK

Provide support and encouragement to individuals or families who have lost a baby through miscarriage, stillbirth or infant death, as well as those struggling with infertility. This group provides resources and compassionate Christian care to church members and their families who are experiencing loss.

HOSPITALITY & EVANGELISM MINISTRIES

Mission: To coordinate efforts in the areas of welcome, new member ministry, evangelism, and community outreach.

HOSPITALITY & EVANGELISM MINISTRIES TEAM

This team explores new possibilities for reaching out to persons in our community, coordinates the Connections Class and other new member ministries, and further develops our congregation's commitment to welcome and include all people.

CONNECTIONS CLASS LEADERS

The Connections Class for prospective members and those new to our congregation is offered 4-6 times per year and lasts for four weeks. Classes meet on Sunday mornings during the Sunday School hour. Leaders are needed to coordinate and organize this class, to lead class discussions, and to provide hospitality to class members.

NEW MEMBER DINNERS HOST

This ministry involves coordinating a dinner for new members two times a year. These Dinners give our new members a chance to continue fellowship with other new members during the year. Volunteers are needed to host, coordinate, set up, clean up, and welcome our new members.

NEW MEMBER SHEPHERDS

Serve by introducing new members to the activities and opportunities available in our church. New Member Shepherds meet with prospective new members during Unity's 4-week long Connections Classes, and are a point of contact for information, friendship, and fellowship for the new member throughout the year. This important ministry helps new members meet other members of the congregation and learn about the church. Shepherds also meet with prospective new members to find out more about the new member and share information about the church.

PICTORIAL DIRECTORY & NEW MEMBER POSTERS

This ministry involves taking pictures of new members as they join, so that the pictures might be used in an updated pictorial directory, as well as church bulletin boards, to visually introduce and welcome our new members.

WELCOME CENTER ATTENDANTS

Welcome Center Attendants are needed for each worship service to answer questions and hand out brochures at the Welcome Center. The Welcome Center is a location where both visitors and members can obtain information that will help them find their way around the church grounds, learn about the different classes and groups that are a part of the church, find out about upcoming special events, learn about the nursery, and many other items of interest.

MEN'S MINISTRIES

Mission: To provide opportunities for spiritual growth through faith, friendship and fellowship.

Men's Ministries is open to all Unity male members, (regardless of age) and their guests. They meet, year round, on the 2nd Tuesday of the month, from 8 am to 9 am in the Fellowship Hall. Their ministry is all about fellowship and spiritual growth. The ministry averages over 50 hours per month in volunteer assistance and project participation time. Look for the meeting notifications in the weekly newsletter, Sunday announcement sheets and the website.

Fellowship and discussion of God's word, along with a breakfast prepared by our members, is our primary goal. We also make use of our time and many talents by assisting members of the congregation when requests are made, working with other Unity ministries that support our congregation and community, completing small projects around the church and participation in various community and Providence Presbytery projects.

MISSION OUTREACH MINISTRIES

Mission: Coordinates all local and international mission efforts. Provides opportunities for all ages to participate in and support service ministries. Lifts up mission outreach ministries within the community and the larger church that deserve the support of the congregation. Works with mission partners to provide support and an exchange of information.

OUTREACH MINISTRY TEAM

Provides oversight and coordination for the outreach ministries of Unity. Encourages church participation in mission & outreach projects. Meets monthly.

ADULT MISSION TRIPS

This team assists in planning, organizing and/or participating in annual Unity sponsored mission trips. Members of Unity are also encouraged to participate in Providence Presbytery's mission efforts whenever offered by the Presbytery.

LIVING WATERS OF THE WORLD

The mission of Living Waters of the World is to provide clean drinking water in locations with that need. Unity has worked in partnership with locations in Mexico to provide clean water systems. Unity installation teams consist of a team leader, an expert(s) in installation, and an expert(s) in teaching. Team members are trained at the “Clean Water University”. Volunteers are needed in these areas as we work to expand this ministry.

AMERICAN RED CROSS BLOODMOBILE

Unity hosts and sponsors a bloodmobile four times each year. Volunteers are needed to help with publicity, to encourage donors, to sign-up donors, and to work the canteen the day of the bloodmobile. Most of all, Unity needs people to donate a pint of blood. This is volunteer work you can do lying down!

CHILDREN’S ATTENTION HOME

The Children’s Attention Home is a 42-bed home that provides 24 hour a day emergency and residential care and supportive services for children who have been physically or sexually abused, abandoned or neglected. The home serves children from birth through 21 years old. Volunteers are needed for tutoring, recreation, gardening, reading to toddlers, office work, arts and crafts and much more.

CROP HUNGER WALK

CROP Hunger Walk, a 1 mile or 3.1 mile walk in Rock Hill, occurs in the fall season each year. The walk raises money for hunger programs through Church World Service. Twenty-five percent of the money raised in York County stays in the county for ongoing hunger programs. A coordinator(s) is needed to plan for church participation. We also need volunteers to handle publicity for the walk, coordinate sign-ups for interested walkers and donors, and walk. It’s good for your soles, too!

DIMES FOR HUNGER

This is a Presbytery-sponsored program to raise money for hunger programs in our 5-county Presbytery, Honduras, Guatemala and Malawi. Unity’s fall program encourages individuals to give one dime per meal for one month. Members are needed to help with publicity, attend the kick-off event in Rock Hill, and to be a part of this event.

FAMILY PROMISE OF YORK COUNTY

Family Promise is a local non-profit organization that provides meals, shelter, support services, and life skills training for homeless parents and children. Unity participates in this mission by providing sleeping rooms and meals in our church to homeless families one week per quarter. The family capacity is limited to 4 families, with no more than 14 persons total.

Family Promise Roles:

FP Leadership Team

Responsible for recruiting and coordinating members for our host weeks and communicating with the Family Promise Executive Director and Board.

FP Grocery Shoppers:

Needed to purchase groceries to be used by the families during the week at the Family Promise Center.

FP Linen Washers:

Needed to wash laundry following our host weeks.

FP Meal Hosts:

Needed to cook and serve dinner to the families.

FP Overnight Hosts:

Needed to sleep at the church overnight and see the families off the next morning.

FP Set up/Clean Up Team:

Members are needed to help with set up and clean up during our host weeks.

FP Transportation Hosts:

Needed to provide transportation to the day center, doctor's visits, job interviews, etc.

FORT MILL CARE CENTER

The Care Center serves those in the community who are in need. Members are needed to work in the food pantry or to help interview clients. Donations of canned goods and school supplies are always welcome.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Volunteer to help build and repair homes for deserving families in the York County area. Unity will sponsor work days each year. Workers of all skill levels, 16 and older, are welcome.

NUTRITION CENTER

This program, which meets in Unity Hall, provides a hot meal and companionship to the elderly in our community who are in need. Volunteers are needed to help with the home-delivered meals on a weekly or substitute basis and to lead activities. Donations to be used as Bingo prizes are also welcome!

REGIONAL AIDS INTERFAITH NETWORK – RAIN

RAIN is a program which enables volunteers, working in Care Teams, to live out their faith in service to persons living with AIDS. RAIN's mission is to develop an informed, compassionate response to those persons. Unity has 2 Care Teams who are now working with their care partners. New team members are welcome.

SEASONAL MISSIONS

The Outreach Ministry encourages participation in the Sharing God's Bounty food drive and the Angel Tree service project before and during Advent. Also, participation in Classroom Ready collection of school supplies in July/August is desired. Other mission projects, such as Blankets Plus and the collection of used eyeglasses, take place all year. Volunteers are needed to help coordinate, oversee, publicize, and participate in these projects.

SECOND HARVEST PARTNERS

This is a program with the overall goal of decreasing hunger in York County. Short-term assistance is provided by food delivered on a tractor-trailer and distributed to those in need. Long-term assistance is provided by development of a strategy that empowers people to become self-sufficient. Unity volunteers are asked to partner with Second Harvest Partners and with other congregations in our area on the assigned work day to assist with organization, unloading the truck of food, filling grocery bags, assisting with parking, greeting guests, and distributing food to individuals.

ALMA EL CHAAB PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH PRAYER PARTNERSHIP

Several churches in Providence Presbyterian have formed "sister" partnerships with Presbyterian churches in Lebanon and Syria. Unity has had a partnership with Alma el Chaab Presbyterian Church in southern Lebanon for several years. Unity supports Alma el Chaab with prayer and communication such as emails, cards, photos, and other media. If you would like to participate in this partnership, please contact a member of the Outreach Ministry Team.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN'S MINISTRIES

Mission: Forgiven and freed by God in Jesus Christ, we commit ourselves:

- To nurture our faith through prayer and Bible study,
- To support the mission of the church worldwide,
- To work for justice and peace, and
- To build an inclusive, caring, loving community of women that strengthens the Presbyterian (U.S.A.) Church and witnesses to the promise of God's kingdom.

Membership is open to all women who choose to participate in or be supportive of Presbyterian Women Ministries in any way. These women may choose to participate in one of the three Circles (Circle names and times are listed on the Opportunities for Ministry Form) who meet monthly for Bible Study and prayer, actively support our members unable to attend meetings, and prepare meals.

Women may serve as Circle leaders, Circle treasurer, or as the Bible Study leader. Planning committees for *Mother*Daughter*Sister*Friend, Ladies' Night Out, and Women's Retreat need your help to serve on these committees. Women's Ministries support Outreach through their giving to Habitat for Humanity, Thank offering, Birthday Brunch offering, Fort Mill Care Center, Nutrition Center, and many more

benevolent gifts. Women may attend Fall and Spring Presbytery-wide gatherings as well as our own *Mother*Daughter*Sister*Friend, Ladies' Night Out, and Women's Retreat. Other Outreach opportunities sponsored by Circles include the Christmas Auction, Samaritans' Purse shoe boxes, Christmas Post, stocking gifts for Presbyterian Home in Clinton, and supporting local schools. Circles send care packages to Unity college students.

STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE MINISTRIES

Mission: To provide direction and emphasis for all facets of individual giving, church development, and spiritual growth within the church through the use of our time, talents and treasures.

STEWARDSHIP MINISTRIES TEAM

Members of this ministry team have responsibility for keeping the issue of being good stewards of all church resources before the congregation throughout the year.

Monthly meetings.

- Planning and implementation of the annual stewardship campaign
- Support for special offerings and projects
- Coordinate & facilitate the Ministries Fair
- Oversight of Church's Annual Budget process
- Facilitate the maximization of sharing of various "time, talents and treasures" within the church.
- Developing a culture of generosity through creative opportunities through giving and sharing.

WORSHIP & MUSIC MINISTRIES

Mission: To provide worship experiences that meet the needs of all church members. This encompasses all worship and musical activity in the church, including special services, communion preparation, all choirs, special music, sanctuary decorations, and worship leadership.

WORSHIP & MUSIC MINISTRIES TEAM

Meetings are held four to six times per year to discuss issues and make decisions relating to Worship & Music ministries. This team works closely with the ministers and Director of Music to provide meaningful and inspirational worship opportunities for people of all ages.

WORSHIP MINISTRIES

ACOLYTE COORDINATORS

Acolytes are worship leaders who carry in the light and light the candles at the beginning of worship and carry the light out at the end of the service. They also help in other worship leadership responsibilities during special services. Acolyte coordinators train and supervise all fourth, fifth and sixth graders who would like to serve as acolytes.

COMMUNION PREPARATION

Serve on a team to prepare the communion elements for Sundays when the Lord's Supper is celebrated. A training class is offered. Preparation occurs on the Saturday before Sunday communion, as well as before, between, and after worship on Sunday, and for special services. Teams normally prepare communion once or twice per year. Bread bakers are also needed.

USHER

Duties for both services include handing out bulletins, assisting people with seating, passing the offering plate, checking pews after the service, collecting Welcome Pad sheets after the 11:00 am service and straightening the sanctuary after the service as needed. Assistance at funerals is also needed.

GREETER

Greeters serve on Sunday at either service, and are asked to arrive in time to warmly welcome those attending worship.

OFFERING ASSISTANT

Adults, youth and children (10+ years old or accompanied by a parent) are needed to collect offering during the 8:45 am or 11:00 am worship service throughout the year. Duties include helping the ushers to collect the offering. Offering Assistants are able to participate in the worship service except during the time the offering is received.

LAY LEADER IN WORSHIP

Adults, youth, and children assist in worship leadership for regular Sunday worship services and special services. A training class is offered for those who are interested in serving in this ministry. Lay leaders are scheduled to assist in worship on a rotating basis, usually no more than four times per year. Duties may include reading scripture, Prayers of the People and Call to Worship.

SANCTUARY BRASS CLEANING & BUFFING

Teams assist with the monthly cleaning and buffing of brass items in the sanctuary. A coordinator is also needed to organize and manage this ministry.

VISUAL ARTS

The Visual Arts team provides help to the Worship & Music Ministries through projects that involve visual artwork and fabric. In the past, this team has worked on making choir robes and banners for worship. Other projects may include such things as helping with costumes for the Christmas Pageant and helping with scenery for backdrops.

Unity Creative Connections (formerly the Chrismon Group) is an ongoing team that uses creative talents such as cross stitch, crochet, knitting, beading Chrismons, quilting, etc. for our church and the community. This group provides an opportunity to connect with others at Unity.

RELATED ARTS

On occasion there may be a need for drama volunteers and liturgical dancers. Drama volunteers would be needed especially to help with children choirs' musicals and pageants. Assistance is often needed helping children rehearse lines, building sets and props, and even adult participation in the play itself. Those with dance experience may be needed to work with the worship leaders and clergy to develop a liturgical dance that would be used in worship to enhance the scripture reading for the day, a Biblical story, or a musical selection.

SANCTUARY FLOWERS

Provide flowers in the sanctuary for Sunday worship. Members will be contacted by the Flower Coordinator when flowers are needed.

SEASONAL DECORATIONS

Set up, decorate, and pack up seasonal decorations for the sanctuary and in other areas throughout the church facilities, as appropriate for the season. Help is needed for setup and take down. Special projects include making and maintaining the Advent Wreath, Christmas decorating in the Sanctuary, making Chrismons to decorate a Chrismon tree, helping decorate a Chrismon tree, as well as other seasonal decorations.

MUSIC MINISTRIES

CHANCEL CHOIR

This choir is open for adults and youth who are in the tenth grade or higher. The Chancel Choir provides service music for worship on a weekly basis. The choir most often sings for 11:00 am worship, but occasionally they do sing at the 8:45 am service. Special music is provided several times during the year, including the annual Lessons and Carols service in December. Rehearsal is on Wednesday at 7:00 pm in the Choir Room.

EARLY SERVICE MUSIC

Music is provided most Sundays at the 8:45 am service. If you are not in the Chancel Choir, or if you are interested in helping to provide music for the early service, this may be of interest to you. Vocalists are used as soloists, in duets, trios or small ensembles. Rehearsals for these services would be arranged on an as needed basis.

INSTRUMENTALIST

If you play an instrument, there are many opportunities for services at Unity. Many anthems for both adults and children require additional instruments. All types of brass (particularly trumpet), flute, oboe, violin, guitar and percussion are occasionally called for. Occasionally a group is formed to play at special events. Piano accompanists are needed from time to time.

CHERUB CHOIR

The Cherub Choir is for children ages 4 through first grade. This choir sings for worship on a regular basis and is responsible for the Christmas Joy Service, special events and musicals. Adult helpers are needed to assist during rehearsals and special programs, serve as accompanists, and to help coordinate special programs. Rehearsals are on Sundays at 5:00-5:45.

JUNIOR CHOIR

The Junior Choir is for children in grades second through fifth. This choir sings for worship on a regular basis and is responsible for the Christmas Joy Service, special events and musicals. Adult helpers are needed to assist during rehearsals and special programs. Rehearsals are on Sundays at 4:15-5:00.

YOUTH CHOIR

This choir is open to all middle and high school students who are interested in singing. This group will most likely meet on a seasonal basis and may sing several times a year for worship services and special occasions such as Christmas and Youth Sunday.

JOYFUL RINGERS

This handbell choir is comprised of adult ringers who are committed to attending weekly rehearsals and playing in worship several times a year. Attendance is crucial for the success of this handbell choir. Prior handbell experience is preferred, but not required. However, the ability to read music is required. Rehearsals are on Wednesdays at 6:00.

HANDBELL SUBSTITUTES

Substitute ringers are needed on occasion to fill a position in either the Joyful Ringers or the Canterbury Bells. It is difficult to rehearse in bells if a spot is missing, so this group serves a vital role in the handbell program. Music reading and handbell experience is strongly advised.

YOUNG ADULTS @ UNITY - YA@U

A network of single and married people in their 20s, 30s and 40s who gather for Bible study, social events, and mission projects. Driven by a love of Christ, and a desire to fellowship with others facing similar life circumstances, all are welcome.

CHURCH OFFICERS

Mission: To provide leadership, governing and mission responsibilities for the life of the church in its tasks of worship and service to God, within the church and in the world.

Ruling elders and deacons are elected every fall to serve a three-year term. The Nominating Committee prayerfully considers all possible officer candidates and brings a slate of names to the congregation for a vote.

DEACON

These officers carry out ministries of compassion within the congregation, as well as other duties assigned by the session. Among the duties currently performed by the deacons are budget management, ushering, upkeep of church property, and contact with church visitors. Deacons serve a three-year term upon the election of the congregation.

RULING ELDER

Along with the ministers, ruling elders provide spiritual leadership for the church, and are responsible for its overall functioning. All active church members are eligible for election. Ruling elders serve a three-year term upon the election of the congregation.

HOMEBOUND COMMUNION VISITS

Ordained ruling elders are needed to assist the session and ministers in a ministry to our homebound members. Ruling elders and ministers go together to visit and share the sacrament of the Lord's Supper with those unable to attend worship. These visits normally take place on weekday afternoons, and are scheduled three to four times per year.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

This team, comprised of church members and officers, places names before the congregation for election to the offices of ruling elder and deacon. They may also be asked to bring other nominations to particular offices as needed.

SERVING COMMUNION IN WORSHIP

Ordained ruling elders are needed to assist the session with serving of communion during worship services.

STAFF TEAM

This team, comprised of church members and officers, provides support and direction for members of the church staff. Includes annual review of salaries and benefits, employment recommendations of non-ordained staff, and support for staff members and their families. Working with the Head of Staff, they carry out a process of evaluation and review, so as to enhance and strengthen the work of each staff member.
