

## MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Have you noticed over the last several weeks that we have been blessed with lots of baptisms? Between September 8th and December 22nd, we will celebrate 15 baptisms here at Unity Presbyterian Church! What an amazing gift!

For all of us remembering our baptism is an essential part of our Christian life. In baptism we remember who and whose we are. It is no wonder than on his most stressful days, the Protestant reformer Martin Luther was known to repeat to himself, "I am baptized. I am baptized."

I want to encourage all of us in this season to return to the beginnings; to remember what is essential and true. As Christians, that is our baptism, for as Pastor Cynthia Jarvis writes: "God's people have their beginnings, their genesis, in hearing the God who calls them out by name."

Before we can even begin to think about keeping a commandment, being a good steward, or engaging in ministry, we must first remember who and whose we are. To capture this, in the mid-1950's the French Reformed Church added powerful words to its baptismal liturgy:

For you, little child, Jesus Christ has come, he has fought, he has suffered. For you he entered the shadow of Gethsemane and the horror of Calvary. For you he uttered the cry, "It is finished!" For you he rose from the dead and ascended into heaven and there he intercedes for you, little child, even though you do not know it. But in this way the word of the Gospel becomes true: "We love him, because he first loved us."

Yes, my friends, in our baptism we are reminded of the gospel, of what God has done for us in Jesus Christ our Lord. Jesus is the one who not only gives the greatest commandment; he lives the greatest commandment. Thus, could that commandment be anything other than, anything less than, "We love him, because he first loved us."

## HERE WE GO A-CAROLING!



#### John Ray and Mary Kimbrell

John Ray was born as a member of Unity Presbyterian Church in 1935 to a family with a long history and legacy of leadership in our church. John Ray served as a deacon and an elder and brings a smile to every face, particularly as he asks the preacher about the weather each Sunday. Mary joined John Ray at Unity after they were married. They raised their three children, John, Mary Caroline, and George at Unity. Mary has served in a wide variety of roles in the church and was the first woman to be elected to serve as an elder. She is also a Presbyterian Women Honorary Life member.

#### Bo and Susan Palmer

Bo and Susan have been members of Unity since 1976. Both of them have served as elders and Bo served several terms as a deacon. ## "THE BIBLE AS IF FOR THE FIRST TIME"

This 6-week adult Sunday School class will meet Oct. 20 through November 24 at 10:00 a.m.

- Do you want to know the Bible better, but you don't know where to begin?
- Have you tried reading the Bible but found it overwhelming and hard to understand?
- Do you hold back from attending Bible studies or classes because you think you'll be embarrassed by your lack of Bible knowledge?

#### If you feel at all like that, this is the perfect class for you!

No prior Bible knowledge required. No embarrassing questions (although you can ask all the questions you wish). Just a solid introduction to how we got the Bible, the message of the Bible, and how to study the Bible on your own. Here's what we'll cover:

#### The Book (Weeks 1 and 2):


- Oct. 20 **"Meeting the Bible As If for the First Time"** (a very basic overview of the Bible: its purpose, structure, and types of literature; biblical translations and choosing a Bible for yourself)
- Oct. 27 **"How We Got the Bible"** (how the Bible was written, compiled, and transmitted from its day to ours)

#### The Message (Weeks 3 and 4):

- Nov. 3 **"The Old Testament in 7 Sentences"** (a summary of key events and themes in the Old Testament, including a timeline)
- Nov. 10 **"The New Testament in 7 Sentences"** (similar to the previous week, but looking at the central events and themes in the New Testament)

#### The Practice (Weeks 5 and 6):

- Nov. 17 **"How To Study the Bible for Yourself"** (an introduction to studying the Bible; foundational principles for interpretation; resources for further study)
- Nov. 24 **"How To Hear God in the Bible"** (the Bible is the Word of God and God speaks to his people through the Bible, but often we struggle with hearing God; we'll look at how we can hear God better in the Bible, as well as how the Bible gets misused) Led by retired pastor Steve Simon, who once had to use his Bible's Table of Contents to find the Gospel of

## **MISSION TRIP TO HONDURAS**

In July of this year, nine eager Unity travelers departed for the annual mission trip to the Trinidad area of Honduras. For 14 years, with only time out for an inconvenient pandemic, Unity members from youth to seniors have been making this trek to assist in constructing concrete block homes for less privileged Hondurans. This year we were joined by three volunteers from Orangewood Presbyterian in Phoenix and First Presbyterian in Sioux Falls. These sister churches share in the cost of buying materials and frequently carry out their own mission trips.

Depending on the construction status when the team arrives, the church volunteers participate in preparing foundations, laying brick walls and spreading concrete floors, duly supervised by our stalwart site foreman, Wilfredo. In addition to the physical labor, the team interacts with the community to build lasting relationships. Unity has supported vision clinics, a music school, and an English language school, as well as the new homeowners in various ways.

Next year's trip is already scheduled for July 9 - 18, 2025. An informational meeting will be scheduled for mid-January. Consider joining in this love filled endeavor and watch the bulletin and the newsletter for more information.



## **FAMILY PROMISE**



What is Family Promise? Family Promise of York County provides a comprehensive and compassionate program of meals, shelter, and case management amilyPromise services to homeless families through a community network of congregations and staff that foster long-term self-sufficiency, independence, and success for families.

How is Unity involved in Family Promise? Once every 2 months Unity serves as a host site for a week from Sunday to Sunday. Families arrive at church in the evening. They are served dinner and spend the night in one of the Sunday School rooms in the Youth Wing. They leave early each morning and go to work, attend school, or work on job skills at the Family Promise Center. Family Promise is an outreach ministry coordinated by the Women of Unity - Tony Dehler Circle. We need many volunteers for the different service opportunities that it requires to host the families during our hosting weeks.

When is our next hosting? Unity has the pleasure of serving as a host church from Sunday, November 17 - Sunday, November 24.

How can I help? You can volunteer during our hosting week. We need over 45 people each hosting (families are welcome) to cook/serve dinner each night; help with set-up or takedown on the Sundays of our hosting week; spend the night with our families; wash laundry following our hosting week; or donate supplies to be used during hosting week. ## GIVING APPRECIATED STOCK

Gifting stock is an easy process. Some benefits of your gift are:

- Completely avoid paying capital gains tax by giving stock directly to a qualified charity.
- Receive a tax deduction up to 30% of adjusted gross income, and there is a five-year carryover
- You may be able to give substantially more with a gift of stock, for the same after-tax cost of giving cash

#### Example:

Charlie Johnson recently made a pledge towards his church's capital campaign, and is considering utilizing stock he owns towards his commitment. Years ago, as a young engineer, he purchased shares of company stock for \$2,000. He since left the firm but held the shares as an investment and they now have a market value of \$10,000.

If he gives the stock to his church, he can claim a charitable deduction of the full market value of the gift (\$10,000). The church can then sell the stock and apply the full proceeds (\$10,000) towards their campaign. And, since a gift to the charity is not a sale, he will not owe any capital gains tax on the transaction.

If Charlie were to sell the stock himself, he will incur \$8,000 in capital gain (\$10,000 market value minus \$2,000 cost basis). After he pays taxes of \$1,200 (the 15 percent capital gains tax rate on the \$8,000 gain), his gift to charity and charitable deduction will be only \$8,800.



## WHAT IS A QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD)?

Generally, a QCD is an otherwise taxable distribution from an IRA, including an inherited IRA (other than an ongoing SEP or SIMPLE IRA) owned by an individual who is age 70<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> or over that is paid <u>directly</u> from the IRA to a qualified charity. Note that recent changes have changed the Requirement Minimum Distribution age to 73, <u>however</u> QCDs are **allowed for persons aged 70-1/2 and up**. Taking advantage of a QCD during those 1-1/2 years prior to turning 72 would have the positive impact of lowering your Required Distributions when they are mandated (age 72 and beyond).

A QCD excludes the amount donated from your taxable income and may keep your taxable income lower, reducing the impact of certain tax credits and deductions.

QCDs don't require you to itemize. Therefore, you may choose to take advantage of the higher standard deduction and still use a QCD for charitable giving.

#### Can I make a QCD?

To make a QCD, certain requirements must be met:

- You must be  $70^{1/2}$  or older
- QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income and, therefore, excludes nondeductible contributions.
- The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a QCD is \$100,000. Your spouse may also be able to make a QCD from his or her own IRA in the same tax year for up to \$100,000.
- Your QCD can be made to one or more charities.
- For a QCD to count towards your current year's RMD, the funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, generally December 31.

#### Why consider using a QCD?

- QCDs are tax exempt
- Distributions aren't added to your income, which may help you qualify for lower Medicare premiums and Social Security tax rates.
- You don't have to change your will or trust.
- The transactions are simple to record on you 1040 form.
- Your gifts immediately support the charity.

#### Tax Reporting

A QCD is reported as a normal distribution on IRS Form 1099-R for any non-inherited IRAs. Itemization is not required to make a QCD. While the QCD amount is not taxed, you may not then claim the distribution as a charitable tax deduction.

#### What are my next steps?

<u>After consulting with your tax or legal advisor</u>, let your IRA custodian know you wish to make a QCD. Be sure to provide them with the information they request. Do not ask the custodian to send the QCD to you. They **must send the QCD directly to the charity.**
