# MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

We have reached the season of Advent. Advent is a time of expectation, and this is symbolized not only by the four-week period of preparation, but also by the lighting of an Advent candle on each Sunday of the season. The four candles provide us with a visual way to count off four Sundays of this season. The flame of each new candle reminds us that something is happening, but something more is still to come. The Advent season is not complete until all four candles are lit, with the central Christ candle also burning brightly on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

The tradition of the Advent wreath is traced back to an old Scandinavian custom that celebrated the coming of light after a season of darkness. In that day, candles were placed on the edge of a horizontal wheel. As the wheel was spun around, the lighted candles would blend into a continuous circle of light. Today we use a circle of evergreen to remind us of the continuous power of God, which knows no beginning nor ending.

Over time the candles have received different names to signify important themes for the Advent season. Here at Unity we use Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. You might also hear the candles identified as Prophets, Bethlehem, Shepherds, and Angels. There is also symbolism in the colors of the candles in the Advent wreath. The three purple candles symbolize the coming of Christ from the royal line of David. The pink candle is lit on the third Sunday of the Advent season. This candle symbolizes joy; its use goes back to the Latin Church, which asked the worshipers to fast during this period of time.

At Unity we've adopted the tradition of inviting families who have joined our church over the last year to light the Candles on the Advent Wreath. This has become a special way of welcoming our newest members to our church family and helping the congregation continue to get to know them.

As we light the candles on the Advent Wreath in worship this year, may we be surprised by Hope and prepare ourselves to welcome Christ as the light of the world!



# MISSION TRIP TO HONDURAS

In July of this year, nine eager Unity travelers departed for the annual mission trip to the Trinidad area of Honduras. For 14 years, with only time out for an inconvenient pandemic, Unity members from youth to seniors have been making this trek to assist in constructing concrete block homes for less privileged Hondurans. This year we were joined by three volunteers from Orangewood Presbyterian in Phoenix and First Presbyterian in Sioux Falls. These sister churches share in the cost of buying materials and frequently carry out their own mission trips.

Depending on the construction status when the team arrives, the church volunteers participate in preparing foundations, laying brick walls and spreading concrete floors, duly supervised by our stalwart site foreman, Wilfredo. In addition to the physical labor, the team interacts with the community to build lasting relationships. Unity has supported vision clinics, a music school, and an English language school, as well as the new homeowners in various ways.

Next year's trip is already scheduled for July 9 - 18, 2025. An informational meeting will be scheduled for mid-January. Consider joining in this love filled endeavor and watch the bulletin and the newsletter for more information.

# LIVING WATERS FOR THE WORLD COMMITTEE WATER SEEKING ADDITIONAL TEAM MEMBERS TO HELP WITH OUR DLANNED WATER PURISICATION WITH OUR PLANNED WATER PURIFICATION INSTALLATION IN GUATEMALA

The Providence Presbytery Living Waters for the World (LWW) Committee is making plans for the installation of a water purification system in Guatemala in 2025. We are looking for others who may feel called to join our Installation Team.

The overall responsibility of the LWW Committee is to plan for Living Waters projects. Some of our committee members will work on publicity and fund-raising; some will visit local churches; and some will be part of the implementation team that will go to the project site. Members of the installation team should have taken the training at Clean Water University which is operated by LWW. Three different one week-long training classes are held two times a year at different locations. These include the "101-Leadership" class and the "102 - Education" class and the "103 - Technical / installation process" class. Click here for descriptions of each class. The one-week Clean Water U training will be in two locations in 2025 - June 17-21 in New Jersey and September 23-27 in Mississippi.

Are you being called to join the LWW Committee and Installation Team? We are especially looking for those Installation Team members who can attend the 101 Leadership training or the 102 Education training classes in order to join our team for the planned 2025 installation. However, if you are not able to travel and be a part of the Installation Team, we still would welcome any individuals to be a part of the LWW Committee.

In addition to Committee and Installation Team members, we continue to raise funds needed to install the water purification system. All contributions should be made to Providence Presbytery and identified as going to the LWW fund. These contributions are tax deductible.

# **GIVING APPRECIATED STOCK**

Gifting stock is an easy process. Some benefits of your gift are:

- Completely avoid paying capital gains tax by giving stock directly to a qualified charity.
- Receive a tax deduction up to 30% of adjusted gross income, and there is a five-year carryover
- You may be able to give substantially more with a gift of stock, for the same after-tax cost of giving cash

# Example:

Charlie Johnson recently made a pledge towards his church's capital campaign, and is considering utilizing stock he owns towards his commitment. Years ago, as a young engineer, he purchased shares of company stock for \$2,000. He since left the firm but held the shares as an investment and they now have a market value of \$10,000.

If he gives the stock to his church, he can claim a charitable deduction of the full market value of the gift (\$10,000). The church can then sell the stock and apply the full proceeds (\$10,000) towards their campaign. And, since a gift to the charity is not a sale, he will not owe any capital gains tax on the transaction.

If Charlie were to sell the stock himself, he will incur \$8,000 in capital gain (\$10,000 market value minus \$2,000 cost basis). After he pays taxes of \$1,200 (the 15 percent capital gains tax rate on the \$8,000 gain), his gift to charity and charitable deduction will be only \$8,800.



# WHAT IS A QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD)?

Generally, a QCD is an otherwise taxable distribution from an IRA, including an inherited IRA (other than an ongoing SEP or SIMPLE IRA) owned by an individual who is age 70½ or over that is paid <u>directly</u> from the IRA to a qualified charity. Note that recent changes have changed the Requirement Minimum Distribution age to 73, <u>however QCDs</u> are **allowed for persons aged 70-1/2 and up.** Taking advantage of a QCD during those 1-1/2 years prior to turning 72 would have the positive impact of lowering your Required Distributions when they are mandated (age 72 and beyond).

A QCD excludes the amount donated from your taxable income and may keep your taxable income lower, reducing the impact of certain tax credits and deductions.

QCDs don't require you to itemize. Therefore, you may choose to take advantage of the higher standard deduction and still use a QCD for charitable giving.

# Can I make a QCD?

To make a QCD, certain requirements must be met:

- You must be 70½ or older
- QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income and, therefore, excludes non-deductible contributions.
- The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a QCD is \$100,000. Your spouse may also be able to make a QCD from his or her own IRA in the same tax year for up to \$100,000.
- Your QCD can be made to one or more charities.
- For a QCD to count towards your current year's RMD, the funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, generally December 31.

# Why consider using a QCD?

- QCDs are tax exempt
- Distributions aren't added to your income, which may help you qualify for lower Medicare premiums and Social Security tax rates
- You don't have to change your will or trust.
- The transactions are simple to record on you 1040 form.
- Your gifts immediately support the charity.

# Tax Reporting

A QCD is reported as a normal distribution on IRS Form 1099-R for any non-inherited IRAs. Itemization is not required to make a QCD. While the QCD amount is not taxed, you may not then claim the distribution as a charitable tax deduction.

# What are my next steps?

After consulting with your tax or legal advisor, let your IRA custodian know you wish to make a QCD. Be sure to provide them with the information they request. Do not ask the custodian to send the QCD to you. They must send the QCD directly to the charity.

# **DONOR ADVISED FUNDS**

# What is a Donor Advised Fund?

A donor-advised fund (DAF), offers a unique giving opportunity. It is especially appealing to individuals who are interested in staying involved in the giving process.

It is like a charitable investment account, for the sole purpose of supporting charitable organizations you care about. When you contribute cash, securities or other assets to a donor-advised fund, you are generally eligible to take an immediate tax deduction. Then those funds can be invested for tax-free growth and you can recommend grants to virtually any IRS-qualified public charity, including churches.

# How does a Donor-Advised Fund work?

#### Make a tax-deductible donation

Donate cash, stocks or non-publicly traded assets such as private business interests, cryptocurrency and private company stock to be eligible for an immediate tax deduction. Appreciated assets may be deductible at the current fair market value and will bypass capital gains tax liability.

A contribution to a donor-advised fund is an irrevocable commitment to charity; the funds cannot be returned to the donor or any other individual or used for any purpose other than grant-making to charities.

## Grow your donation, tax-free

Your donation can potentially grow over time with no tax consequences for you, making available even more money for charities. Most investment organizations have a variety of investment options from which you can recommend an investment strategy for your charitable dollars.

### Support charities you love, now or over time

You can support virtually any IRS-qualified public charity with grant recommendations from the donor-advised fund—including Unity Presbyterian Church.

#### Easy, no cost way to change charitable beneficiaries

Although the assets in the DAF cannot be removed, you control their distribution during your lifetime and can name and change any residual balance without the help of an attorney, as you would with a will or a trust.

Your financial or tax advisor can help determine it this fits your financial situation.
