

# MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

With the inauguration of President Trump on January 20 and the Inaugural Prayer Service held at the Washington National Cathedral the next day, many are asking questions about the relationship between politics and preaching as multiple prayers from various Christian perspectives were offered at both events. I thought I would share a few of the ways that I try to approach such questions for us here at Unity Presbyterian Church.

As Presbyterians we are committed to a theology that what we believe should influence how we live our lives. Since our lives are lived as a part of communities and nations, our faith will always be "political." Think of the number of times Jesus interacts with the politicians and political leaders in his day. Throughout scripture we see God using and/or critiquing political figures and authorities to accomplish God's plans and purposes. So, as Christians, our faith is always personal but never private.

As Presbyterians we are also committed to a theology that says, with the help of the Holy Spirit, each person is able to read scripture for themselves and discern God's particular call for them. Pastors, teachers, elders, bishops, or popes do not get to determine what it is that each of us as followers of Jesus believe. We all seek to test our readings of scripture and understandings of God's call to us in conversation with others in the church, but ultimately we each possess a freedom of conscience around issues of faith and belief.

With these two commitments, we gather as a church for worship each week, we pray, and we hear sermons. My hope is that worship, prayers, and preaching all help us: 1) praise God and 2) draw us into a conversation with a scripture text and the world so that we might be better disciples of Jesus Christ in the week ahead. We lift up scriptural visions of how God would have the world be (love, mercy, justice, hospitality, common human dignity, etc.) in ways that are undoubtedly political, but I hope are not partisan (i.e. we do not advocate for particular candidates or policies). In fact, preaching like Jesus and the prophets tends to be critical of all political parties and officials for all fall short of the glory of God.

We pray that worship, prayers, and preaching at Unity draws us all into moments of pondering the interaction between the text and the world; not simply giving you a "do you agree or not with what the preacher said." We hope that everyone who hears a sermon or joins a prayer at Unity will consider what the gospel means for their own life and faith, for what they post online, for who they vote for, and for the ways they advocate on behalf of others - but very rarely will you hear specifically how you are supposed to do those things. That part remains up to you with the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

As a friend recently shared with me, perhaps our particular calling in every political moment is to something like prophetic compassion and humility. Whenever you have a question, concern, or thought, our doors are always open. We will always be better together as we seek to hear and act on God's word to us today.

share around our small group tables. No



#### HEALTH TIP Dry Skin in Winter

We are all feeling the effects of lower outdoor humidity and dry indoor heat. Here are a few common-sense tips that consistently appear in medical publications:

1. Take shorter showers in order to retain more natural oil in your skin. Pat, don't rub, dry if you are experiencing skin that is itchy and irritated.

2. Lower the temperature of your shower/bath water. Hot water strips your skin of natural oils more quickly.

3. Apply moisturizer immediately after bathing, while your skin is still damp. Know the difference between lotions and moisturizers. Lotions contain more water and are absorbed more quickly, while moisturizers are creamier and thicker. Most people can benefit from a moisturizer in the winter.

4. Consider using a humidifier. 5. Look for products that are

"fragrance-free". Those labelled "unscented" can contain chemicals that are used to mask the scents of other ingredients.



Each year the Women of Unity nominate and select an extraordinary woman to receive the Presbyterian Women Honorary Life Membership Award. This is a national honor originating in 1912 from the Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A). It recognizes women that are known for their commitment to Christ and the mission of the church. This award honors the woman who has given of herself over her lifetime in devoted service to her church and community. A woman who has impacted the lives of many with her love, generosity, and actions.

#### The following guidelines apply for this nomination:

- Any woman who has been active member of Unity Presbyterian Church for no less than 5 years.
- The nominee should be no younger than 30 years of age.
- The nominee may or may not be currently active in a Women of Unity Circle.
- Consider how this nominee has used her time and talents to service God, the church, her family and the community.



# **DID YOU KNOW?**

Did You Know, like all entities, Unity pays fees for collecting certain donations?

- Cash & Checks are handled in-house and do not have fees associated with depositing them.
- Online giving initiated through your financial institution does not have fees associated with depositing them.
- Automatic Bank Draft where you provide Unity's financial office with your bank's routing and account number, and we pull the donation monthly or quarterly. There is a small batch fee that when spread over many donations is pennies for each donation.
- Online Giving initiated through Unity's Realm system carry both a transaction fee for each transaction and a processing fee as a percentage of the transaction.


Ecumenical Mission Trip to Mexico May 24-30, 2025

This is where our missionaries, Mark Adams and Miriam Maldonado are serving. We will spend 7 days learning about the work that they and their Mexican partners are doing.
