

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As we continue through the Season of Lent and our 2025 "Lift Up!" Stewardship Campaign, I want to explore with you the spiritual practice of "generosity." In their book *The Paradox of Generosity*, Christian Smith and Hilary Davidson say:

Generosity is the virtue of giving good things to others freely and abundantly. It is a learned character trait that involves attitude and action entailing both the inclination and the actual practice of giving liberally. It is not a haphazard behavior but a basic organization of life. What generosity gives can vary: aid, encouragement, and more but it always intends to enhance the true wellbeing of the receiver. Like all virtues, generosity is in people's genuine enlightened self-interest to learn and practice

That's a mouthful, but to briefly touch on a few of the elements:

- Generosity is giving good things "freely and abundantly" so generosity is not an obligation, giving out of compulsion, or from a sense of guilt. To be generous is to give willingly!
- Generosity is a learned character trait we are all born pretty selfish, but generosity is a virtue we can learn and a spiritual practice that we can develop with practice and opportunity.
- Generosity includes both inclination and action when we nurture a spirit of generosity, we nurture both our willingness to give and then we actually follow through and give freely.
- Generosity is a basic organization of life generosity as a spiritual practice becomes a way of life, a way of being, a way of organizing our life so that we are always on the lookout for opportunities to respond to God's grace and share our time, talents, and treasures with others. In this way, generosity is not an occasional gift, but a way of life that leads to giving.
- Generosity intends to enhance the true wellbeing of the receiver generosity does not give in hopes of getting something in return in a transactional way; neither does the spiritual practice of generosity give with "strings attached." The only intention is to enhance the wellbeing of the receiver.
- Generosity benefits the one who is generous while we do not practice generosity in order to receive something from the recipient of our gifts, we discover with true generosity that living in this way enhances our own life and faith.

May we continue to nurture the spiritual practice of generosity together at Unity Presbyterian Church, remembering as the apostle Paul wrote in his second letter to the Corinthians, "You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us, for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God." (2 Cor. 9:11-12).



lot!); and the vision we have for faithful use of our money and resources in the future. There's no doubt that "money talks," so come and see what yours might be saying.


CONGREGATIONAL MEETING - MARCH 30TH



LIFT UP: STEWARDSHIP 2025 - BUILDING & GROUNDS MINISTRY



The mission of the Building and Grounds Ministry Team is to use our campus to create a welcoming and safe place to worship and serve God. In 2025 we are working on four major projects that need everyone's time, talent, and financial support.

In December 2024, our campus insurance carrier unexpectedly notified us that they would not be renewing our coverage, effective February 23, 2025. Zeno Wall and Dave Reimer worked with several potential carriers to ensure solid and comparable coverage would be in place before our previous policy expired. We were able to negotiate a new policy with Brotherhood Mutual, fortunately at only a slight increase in premium.

Also in December 2024, our Landscaping Company announced it was retiring. We interviewed multiple candidates, looking for a company to give Unity a full range of services at an affordable price. The Session approved a new contract with Sanchez Landscaping who will be providing expanded service to the church, but does result in B&G increasing their budget request for landscaping by \$5000 budget request for the 2025-26 fiscal year.

B&G and our Green Thumb team are bringing more color to our campus. Two hundred daffodil bulbs were planted and Lenten Roses were added in front of the Historic Sanctuary. The flowers are already blooming, so we hope you will enjoy this beautiful addition to our grounds.

To address potholes and other hazards, with an approved budget of \$105,000, the paving project for the Circular Drive and the Fellowship Hall parking lot was completed on Saturday, March 15th. The week of the 24th, stone will be added along the edge of the asphalt to create a smoother transition into the grass. An additional \$9,950 was approved to increase handicap parking and improve pedestrian access to the Fellowship Hall and Historic Sanctuary. These funds will be drawn from the Major Maintenance Reserve Fund.

Finally, ensuring our church campus is safe and welcoming remains a priority. The Safety Ministry Team and Session have directed B & G to make recommendations for an automated door locking system. Preliminary estimates for the system and the rekeying of the remaining exterior campus doors that will not be automated is approximately \$55,000.

Unity Presbyterian Church holds an historic position in Fort Mill. We are a dynamic and growing church, with room to grow more. Our campus and buildings should convey the message: 'Come visit us, enjoy our hospitality, you are safe here with us. Join us in service to God.' We hope you will join with Building and Grounds as we 'Lift Up' our facilities and campus and as we make or renew our commitments of time, talents, and treasures on **Commitment Sunday, March 30th**.


DID YOU KNOW?

Did You Know, like all entities, Unity pays fees for collecting certain donations?

- Cash & Checks are handled in-house and do not have fees associated with depositing them.
- Online giving initiated through your financial institution does not have fees associated with depositing them.
- Automatic Bank Draft where you provide Unity's financial office with your bank's routing and account number, and we pull the donation monthly or quarterly. There is a small batch fee that when spread over many donations is pennies for each donation.
- Online Giving initiated through Unity's Realm system carry both a transaction fee for each transaction and a processing fee as a percentage of the transaction.
