

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

On Sunday, April 6th we will celebrate with 13 of Unity's 8th graders as we recognize their public statements of faith on Confirmation Sunday. This Sunday is always one of the highlights of the year for us at Unity and we are blessed once again with an outstanding group of young people in the Confirmation Class.

As we prepare to celebrate with our youth this year, I wanted to share with you an interesting transition that has happened over the last decade or so around confirmation. For many years, Confirmation was understood as when "youth joined the church." Whether they had to memorize the questions and answers to a catechism, attend meetings with the pastor(s), or write their own statements of faith, the end goal was for each young person to "join the church."

Two concerns emerged with viewing confirmation as "joining the church." The first is that it discounts God's claim upon us as children of God in our baptism. The sacrament of beginning and initiation into membership of the church has always been baptism. And as Presbyterians we have been committed to the theology that God calls us and makes us members of the church - the best we can do is respond with faith, gratitude, and praise. So, in a formal sense, we "join the church" in our baptism and then become active members through "confirming" for ourselves the promises of faith someone else made for us at our baptism.

The second concern is that seeing confirmation as how one "joins the church" implies it is the end of the journey. Youth come to the Session meeting, memorize the right answers, and check the box, but there's no need to study, to grow or to learn any more. Institutional survival is ensured because confirmation adds one more name to the church's membership rolls and (hopefully) a new pledge card is turned in, at least for that year.

Recognizing these concerns, Christian educators and pastors have been recasting confirmation in terms of discipleship and mission. Retired PCUSA educator and curriculum writer Mark Hines puts it this way:

"Missional confirmation inspires a missional identity and commissions young people to a missional way of life. It is not about joining the church; it's about joining the missional project initiated by Jesus and entrusted to the church. The missional community affirms each young person as a Spirit-gifted disciple and strengthens them as partners in God's mission to transform the world. Following Jesus' practice, missional confirmation models faith formation as an embodied task — a shared practice within a relationship of trust ... in which the missional imperative is caught more than taught." https://pres-outlook.org/2023/04/moving-from-membership-confirmation-to-missional-confirmation/

So, on Confirmation Sunday, we are celebrating not merely new active members of Unity Presbyterian Church; we are celebrating and surrounding with our prayers new disciples of Jesus Christ who are commissioned to be the church in the world, everywhere they go. I know this group, and all of our youth, will lead us toward being more faithful as we join God's work in the world. If only we have the courage and the faith to follow.


Lenten Prayer & Reflection

FINDING MY STORY IN THE PSALMS

We often turn to the book of Psalms for spiritual encouragement, for assistance in worshiping God, or as model prayers. But do you see yourself in the Psalms? Do the Psalms tell your story? In this five-week class we'll explore five psalms that are rarely studied but that yield rich insights for answering questions like: Who am I ... really? Where did I come from? How has God's hand been on my life? Can God ever forgive me for ...? How can I trust God more? The class will be led by Steve Simon, who is a retired Presbyterian pastor and the author of the book Holy Walks: Learning and Praying the Psalms. The Psalms we'll focus on include: Psalm 103 ("Rooted in God's Love"), Psalm 104 ("The Creator of All"), Psalm 105 ("A Faithful God"), Psalm 106 ("An Unfaithful People"), and Psalm 107 ("Tales of God's Deliverance"). As time allows, we'll also examine Psalm 78, psalms of lament, and various other psalms. "Let the one who is wise heed these things and ponder the loving deeds of the Lord" (Ps. 107:43).

Deep breathing exercises offer numerous benefits, including stress reduction, improved lung function, enhanced focus, improved immune response, lower blood pressure and heart rate, better sleep, reduce sinus congestion, and much more. This is well published in medical journals and many books have been written on the subject. Just five to ten minutes 3-4 times a week will have dramatic results. Do it listening to a talking book or watching the news. Inhale deeply through your nose for 5 seconds, then exhale all the way for 5 seconds through your nose. There are apps on your phone that are subtle and help with your timing. It will take a couple of weeks, but you will start to notice a difference. This is an easy way to a healthier lifestyle.




