## **OPPORTUNITIES TO CONNECT, WORSHIP, GROW, AND SERVE**

### <u>Worship</u>

**TODAY IN WORSHIP**, we will be celebrating the Lord's Supper, also known as Communion. Communion is one of two sacraments in the Presbyterian Church (USA). Each time the Lord's Supper is celebrated, we remember the meals Jesus shared with his disciples, we give thanks for the gifts God has given us, we receive hope for the future, and we commit ourselves to share God's love with the world. In the PC(USA), "The opportunity to eat and drink with Christ is not a right bestowed upon the worthy, but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. All who come to the table are offered the bread and cup, regardless of their age or understanding." The Lord's Supper is a 'heavenly mystery'; none of us can ever fully understand it. It is the decision of each parent/guardian when they want their child(ren) to begin participating in Communion. Parents are encouraged to have ongoing conversations with their child(ren) and consider welcoming their child(ren) to participate in the Sacrament as soon as the child(ren) express a desire.

**CHILDREN OF ALL AGES** are welcome in worship. If you find that you need to leave the service to care for your child, Room M201 is open, and is connected to the sanctuary sound system. Ask an usher in the Narthex if you need directions.

**NURSERY IS AVAILABLE** during today's worship services in Room S104 for infants-18 months and S103 for toddlers/ preschoolers up through age 3. Both rooms are located on the bottom floor of the Sanctuary building. Our nursery is run by trained, paid staff with assistance from trained church volunteers. Age-appropriate Bible stories and activities are offered throughout the morning. Children may be dropped off up to 15 minutes prior to a worship service or may attend worship with you until the Children's Time, and then will be taken to nursery by our volunteers and staff. If your child plans to leave the service following Children's Time, please complete a bright yellow Child Identification Sticker, found in the pew rack. Place it on your child's back. Please check "nursery" on the sticker and add a cell phone number in case of an emergency.

**CIW IS AVAILABLE** during today's worship services. "Children in Worship" is a Montessori-based worship program for young children (those who turned 4 before September 1st, 2024, those who are Rising Kindergarten and 1st graders as well as those who have just completed 1st grade). They learn to worship in a way that corresponds to corporate worship yet addresses their needs as young children. Please bring your child with you to worship in the sanctuary and complete a Child Identification Sticker, found in the pew rack, and place it on your child's back. Check "CIW" on the sticker and add a cell phone number in case of an emergency. After the Children's Time, your child will be escorted to the CIW Room (M206) on the children's Sunday school wing.

**SANCTUARY WORSHIP IS LIVESTREAMED** - Please note that as you join us for worship in the Sanctuary, there is a possibility that you will be seen on the online livestream. If you have any questions or concerns, please let us know by contacting Dr. Matt Rich at the church office at 803-547-5543. Over the last several weeks we have experienced technical difficulties with livestreaming our worship services. The Communications Team is actively working to resolve these issues and hopes to have everything resolved as soon as possible.

## Spiritual Pilgrimage to Scotland: April 17 - 25, 2026

**RETREAT, RENEWAL, & PILGRIMAGE** are spiritual practices at the heart of the Christian community. We invite you to participate in a travel pilgrimage to Scotland in the Spring of 2026. Such a journey encourages us to be more than tourists, intentionally engaging with what we see and do in holy places, with people we are bound to in this community of faith, while also learning about the faith of those who have gone before us. A few details for our trip:

- Trip leaders will be Matt Rich, Kathryn McGregor, and Jim Wallace (a native Scot and minister of the Church of Scotland who has led trips full-time for the last 10 years).
- The trip itinerary will include Edinburgh, Sterling, St. Andrews, the Scottish Highlands, Loch Ness, the Isle of Mull, and Iona with a combination of religious and historical sites.
- <u>Cost (not including airfare):</u>
  - \$4495 per/person if reserved by May 21st for double occupancy
  - \$4595 per/person if reserved by July 2nd for double occupancy
  - Single room accommodations are available at an additional \$1165/person
- Early Bird Registration nonrefundable deposit of \$200 is due by May 21st.
