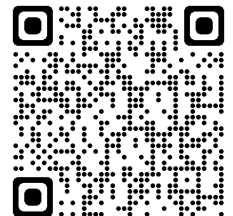
WE RESPOND TO GOD'S CALL

Worship

TODAY IN WORSHIP, we will be celebrating the Lord's Supper, also known as Communion. Communion is one of two sacraments in the Presbyterian Church (USA). Each time the Lord's Supper is celebrated, we remember the meals Jesus shared with his disciples, we give thanks for the gifts God has given us, we receive hope for the future, and we commit ourselves to share God's love with the world. In the PC(USA), "The opportunity to eat and drink with Christ is not a right bestowed upon the worthy, but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. All who come to the table are offered the bread and cup, regardless of their age or understanding." The Lord's Supper is a 'heavenly mystery'; none of us can ever fully understand it. It is the decision of each parent/guardian when they want their child(ren) to begin participating in Communion. Parents are encouraged to have ongoing conversations with their child(ren) and consider welcoming their child(ren) to participate in the Sacrament as soon as the child(ren) express a desire. The communion bread we will use today was made by children who participated in this year's Worship and Sacraments Workshop.

CHILDREN OF ALL AGES are welcome in worship. If you find that you need to leave the service to care for your child, Room M201 is open, and is connected to the sanctuary sound system. Ask an usher in the Narthex if you need directions.

NURSERY IS AVAILABLE during today's worship services in Room S104 for infants-18 months and S103 for toddlers/preschoolers up through age 3. Both rooms are located on the bottom floor of the Sanctuary building. Our nursery is run by trained, paid staff with assistance from trained church volunteers. Age-appropriate Bible stories and activities are offered throughout the morning. Children may be dropped off up to 15 minutes prior to a worship service or may attend worship with you until the Children's Time, and then will be taken to nursery by our volunteers and staff. If your child plans to leave the service following Children's Time, ***please complete a bright yellow Child Identification Sticker, found in the pew rack. Place it on your child's back. Please check "nursery" on the sticker and add a cell phone number in case of an emergency.***

CIW IS AVAILABLE during today's worship services. "Children in Worship" is a Montessori-based worship program for young children (those who turned 4 before September 1, 2026, and those who are in Kindergarten and 1st grade). They learn to worship in a way that corresponds to corporate worship yet addresses their needs as young children. ***Please bring your child with you to worship in the sanctuary and complete a Child Identification Sticker, found in the pew rack, and place it on your child's back. Check "CIW" on the sticker and add a cell phone number in case of an emergency.*** After the Children's Time, your child will be escorted to the CIW Room (M206) on the children's ministries hallway.

SANCTUARY WORSHIP IS LIVESTREAMED - Please note that as you join us for worship in the Sanctuary, there is a possibility that you will be seen on the online livestream. If you have any questions or concerns, please let us know by contacting Dr. Matt Rich at the church office at 803.547.5543.

OUR CHILDREN ARE LEARNING ABOUT WORSHIP - If you notice some small signs around the sanctuary for the next couple of weeks, this is part of the Worship & Sacraments Workshop that our children in second grade and older participated in recently. They learned about the furniture and symbols in our worship space, as well as the parts of our worship service, including our sacraments, so they can more fully participate in worship. Thank you for supporting them as they grow in their faith.

Children's Ministry

A NEW SAFE PLACE RETRAINING IS OFFERED for those who have been trained at Unity in the past. Safe Place at Unity is required every 5 years. When you are due for retraining and if you are still serving in Children's or Youth Ministry, you will receive an email from Anissa Lee in the church office with a link to a 20-minute retraining video and a 10-question quiz that you can take on your own time. This will be in place of the regular hour-long training that new volunteers attend. Please take the time to take this brief retraining course by the deadline provided in the email so we can continue to be faithful in ensuring the safety of our children, youth and volunteers. 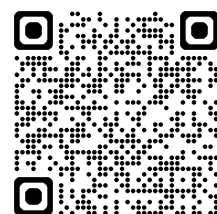

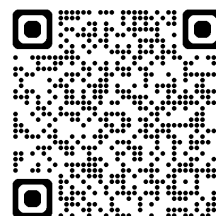
Men's Ministry

Outreach

TODAY IS PEANUT BUTTER & JELLY SUNDAY. Last month, we collected 381 lbs. of food and supplies for the Fort Mill Care Center, bringing our year-to-date total to 2,838 lbs. Current needs at the Care Center include canned potatoes, canned chili beans, canned collards, cooking oil & spray, salad dressing, Teriyaki sauce, frosting, and coffee. **(NOTE: Any food, hygiene, or cleaning items are welcome, but they are currently overstocked on pasta and peanut butter.)** Please bring your donations and deposit them in the collection box in the Narthex any time you are at church. You can also drop off donations, including any refrigerated items, directly at the Fort Mill Care Center. Summer hours for the Care Center are Monday and Wednesday from 9 to 12 and Wednesday from 5 to 7. They will be closed on Friday through Labor Day. MONEY FOR MEALS SPECIAL OFFERING IN SEPTEMBER - For nearly 50 years, Providence Presbytery has worked to end hunger both locally and across the globe. This program has previously been known as Dimes for Hunger, and has raised more than \$2 million -- one donation at a time -- to end hunger in our local area and across the globe. The goal is for participating families to donate one dollar for every meal, every day during the month of September. You can give each week, or wait until the last Sunday of the month to bring your offering. There are calendars for families and children to pick up in the narthex today to help track your meals for the month. Half of the funds raised each year go toward feeding hungry people in the five counties within Providence Presbytery. 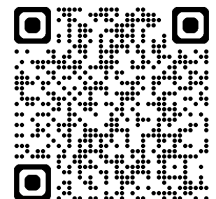
